

Uku SÄREKANNO is serving as Deputy Executive Director for EBCG Information Management and Processes. He is responsible for the implementation of the European Travel Information and Authorization System (ETIAS) and interoperability framework. He is also in charge of the Agencies corporate functions related to ICT, financial management, security and facilities. His tasks involve oversight and coordination of the ETIAS Central Unit Division and Financial, Digital and Security Division.

After graduating from Tallinn University in 2004 (*MA in Public Administration*) he started his career in the Estonian Government Office, coordinating EU related IT developments as well as key databases and document management systems. He also advised the Estonian Prime Minister on EU Affairs and European Council related preparations.

During his 19-year-long career Mr Särekanno has worked in senior level positions in the Estonian public administration and European Union institutions. He joined EBCG from the European Union Agency for the Operational Management of Large-Scale IT Systems in the Area of Freedom, Security and Justice(eu-LISA) where he served as Head of Cabinet, responsible for general coordination of the Agencies key activities.

Before joining eu-LISA in 2019, he served as Deputy Director General of the Estonian Information System Authority, an agency responsible for the operational management of key components of the Estonian e-governance system, including electronic identity management, governmental network, X-road, CERT-EE and cyber security framework. He served as the Head of National Cyber Security Coordination as well as both a Member of the ENISA Management Board (European Union Agency for Cybersecurity) and ECSO's Board of Directors (European Cyber Security Organisation).

Prior to that he worked in various positions for the Estonian administration, including Director of Law Enforcement and Criminal Policy in the Ministry of the Interior and Justice and Home Affairs Counsellor in the Estonian Permanent Representation to the EU. He coordinated preparations for the Estonian Presidency of the EU Council as Chief of Staff in the Estonian Permanent Representation to the EU and served as a senior policy officer in the European Commission Task-Force 50 (Brexit), supporting Mr Barnier's team in the coordination of TF50 relations with the Presidency, Council and European Parliament.

Mr Särekanno holds a Master of Law from the University of Tartu (2020), has provided lectures in universities and written articles for national and international press. The Estonian Police and Border Guard Board awarded him with the Medal of Honour in 2014.
